## Why a need for such a Working Group?

- Faced with several problems related to the quality of RDTs along the procurement pathway, several agencies decided to share QA concerns and approaches
- Diversity of QA strategies among stakeholders
- Little communication among stakeholders and between stakeholders and manufacturers
- Informal and irregular interactions between stakeholders were not productive enough

## Feedback to manufacturers (2012)\*

#### **Procuring quality HIV Diagnostic Tools**

Meeting with manufacturers, implementers and agencies 31st January 2012 The Global Fund - Geneva

- 1. Agencies/QA programs are communicating and collaborating among themselves
- Quality Assurance of MD is fundamental to provide proper medical care, as well as for sustainability of testing programs
- 3. Unequivocal identity for products/ Traceability and transparency for products need to be assured
- Proactive communication/notification from manufacturers on changes is expected
- 5. Trust is fundamental (agencies, programs, manufacturers)
- 6. Recognition from our side: we need (agencies/programs) to clearly communicate available procurement data/ to provide more precise data on forecasting

## Following step:

#### Need

- to increase communication and harmonized approaches on QA but also on additional areas: procurement, market dynamic, communication with manufacturers /with countries
- to involve a wider range of partners
- In February 2013 the first meeting lead to the launch of the

#### **HIV Global Diagnostic Working Group (GDWG)**

A forum to share information and to align actions and communications with respective constituencies.

#### **Goal of the GDWG**

To promote communication, collaboration and coordination

- for equitable access to affordable, quality-assured IVDs
- for more effective diagnosis of HIV infection and management of HIV-related disease in developing countries.

#### **Objectives**

#### The GDWG has five main objectives

- To strengthen communication, collaboration & coordination towards the optimal selection and use of quality-assured products
- 2. To effectively respond in a timely and coordinated manner to urgent quality-related issues
- To provide aligned messages to global, regional, and country level users on quality assurance for product selection and testing implementation
- 4. To provide aligned messages to manufacturers
- To advocate for diagnostic tests that are appropriate and affordable

## Membership

- Involvement in and commitment to international QA standards for product market entry, selection, assessment, procurement, delivery and use
- Global or regional mandate/involvement in HIV-related IVDs
- Expertise in IVD market dynamics


